EUROPEAN COMMISSION | **EXECUTIVE BODY**

The European Commission is the executive body of the EU. It operates as a cabinet government with 27 Commissioners. It is divided into departments called 'Directorates-General' or DGs

- Well-connected at all levels, especially DG AGRI and its Organic Unit, and DG ENV, DG CLIMA,
 DG SANTE, DG Research & Innovation and their units
- Commissioners and Commission representatives participate to our events, like our 20-years anniversary and European Organic Congress 2024
- Take part in diverse consultations and are a member of Advisory and Civil Dialogue Groups (CDGs) on topics relevant to organic farming

COUNCIL OF THE EU | LEGISLATIVE BODY

The Council of the EU is one of the EU's two legislative bodies. National Ministers of each EU Member State represent the country on certain policy areas

- Regular contact with national Permanent Representations
- Coordinate advocacy to ensure Council positions consider organic
- Cooperation with Council Presidencies, such as our European Organic Congress 2024

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT | LEGISLATIVE BODY

The European Parliament is one of the EU's two legislative bodies. EU citizens directly elect its representatives, Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) every five years

- Good relationships with key MEPs on topics crucial to organic, such as CAP, GMOs and NGTs
- Key MEPs attend political events, for example the European Organic Congress 2024
- Co-organising and speaking at MEPs' events like a press conference on Green Claims, the GMO-free regions event and more


